



Annual Graduate Student Paper Competition

The Jonathan Edwards Center at TEDS invites submissions to its Graduate Student Paper Competition. Papers must focus on Jonathan Edwards (1703-1758), his contexts, or his legacies, and must be written in English. Each year's winner will receive a cash prize of \$500 (U.S.) and publication of his/her paper in *Jonathan Edwards Studies*.

Papers are due by *May 15* of each year, and the winner will be announced by August 1.

Eligibility

- All full- and part-time graduate students from anywhere in the world are eligible to participate.
- Papers must focus on Jonathan Edwards, his contexts, or his legacies.
- Papers must be original, and not pledged elsewhere.

Guidelines

- Papers should be of superior, publishable quality, and should follow the Author Guidelines published in *Jonathan Edwards Studies*, available at: jestudies.yale.edu/jes/index.php/journal/about/submissions#authorGuidelines
- Papers must be written in **English**.
- Papers must be readable in **Microsoft Word**.
- Papers must be received no later than **May 15**.

Awards

- Cash prize of **\$500** (U.S.)
- Guaranteed **publication** in *Jonathan Edwards Studies*.
- The winner will be announced on **August 1**.

Papers will be assessed by a committee led by Professor Douglas A. Sweeney, Director, Jonathan Edwards Center at TEDS, and including the other global Jonathan Edwards Center directors.
